Transportation

- 1800
 - By land?

– By water?

- 1850
 - By land: Locomotives connected major cities in the East
 - Coast to coast by1869
 - By water: Steamboats could go upstream against current

Communication


- 1800
 - only as fast as it could be carried
 - By land
 - By water

- 1850
 - Faster by land and water than before
 - Telegraph by 1851
 connected major
 cities in North, East
 and South
 - By 1861. coast to coast


Changes in transportation and communication

 - for agricultural goods


The U.S. in 1800
